I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.”

Then there came a voice to him that said, “What are you doing here, Elijah?” ¹⁴ He answered, “I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts, for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.” ¹⁵ Then the LORD said to him, “Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. ¹⁶ Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel, and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place. ¹⁷ Whoever escapes from the sword of Hazael, Jehu shall kill, and whoever escapes from the sword of Jehu, Elisha shall kill. ¹⁸ Yet I will leave seven thousand in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him.”

²² [Jesus] made the disciples get into a boat and go on ahead to the other side [of the Sea of Galilee,] while he dismissed the crowds.²³ And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone,²⁴ but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them.²⁵ And early in the morning he came walking toward them on the sea.²⁶ But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, saying, “It is a ghost!” And they cried out in fear.²⁷ But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, “Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.”

²⁸ Peter answered him, “Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.”²⁹ He said, “Come.” So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came toward Jesus.³⁰ But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and, beginning to sink, he cried out, “Lord, save me!”³¹ Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, “You of little faith, why did you doubt?”³² When they got into the boat, the wind ceased.³³ And those in the boat worshiped him, saying, “Truly you are the Son of God.”

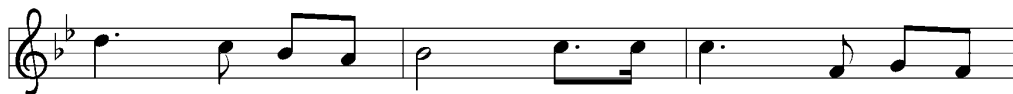

THANK YOU FOR CHRISTMAS IN JULY ITEMS

Thank you to everyone who donated items for Metro Lutheran Ministry's Christmas in July. The items were delivered this week for later distribution to neighbors in need at the Christmas Store in December. If you missed the July collection, we'll hold another one closer to Christmas.

HOSANNA! GARDEN

Veggies are growing in our Hosanna! veggie garden! We've already been able to donate some peppers and cucumbers for In As Much Ministry food pantry and things will be picking up even more soon. The cucumber plants are doing great from our Hosanna day seed starting! If you'd like to help with the maintenance and harvesting of the garden, please contact Bonny or Margaret G for more info.

FIRE CODE ADJUSTMENT TO KITCHEN

Because a daycare utilizes our kitchen, the state fire marshal is requiring us to add a minimum of 18" between the stoves to mitigate fire risks. The issue was raised prior to the daycare opening, but the fire marshal at the time did not require us to change it. We thought we had an acceptable alternative solution to the current mandate, but all variances and appeals by Brighton Academy were denied by the state daycare licensing agency.

Therefore, the location of cabinets and stoves have been swapped. The center countertop, backsplash, gap covers, and floor trim will be installed soon.

We are taking this opportunity to improve the organization and functionality of the kitchen by reorganizing, relocating dishes, and adding outlets.

WOMEN OF THE ELCA CONVENTION!

The Women of the ELCA is set up similar to our synod. There are the congregational units (Shirley Circle), Clusters (Border), SWO's (Central States Synod – Women of the ELCA) and Churchwide. All are intertwined together, with our purpose statement being:

As a community of women created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the society, and the world.

Every triennial the Women of the ELCA, meet to discuss and make decisions that direct the next three years of our organization. Our Synod Wide Organization was represented by five voting members, who were elected at the Central States Women of the ELCA convention – Janice Gerken, Gaye Mizell, Jean Bardy, Rhonda Templing and Louise Ahrens. They joined the other voting members from across the country via zoom to make decisions on constitutional revisions, budget and memorials (these are actions that guide the vision of Women of the ELCA for the next triennial).
