Frequently Asked Questions About Sabbatical...

When is sabbatical?

Pastor Mike will be out of the office and unavailable June 2 through August 3.

Why is Pastor Mike taking sabbatical?

Being a pastor is a 24/7 job--Pastor Mike cares for you even when he's not in the office. He does so willingly and joyfully, but it can be exhausting. 17 years in non-stop ministry (9 years at Hosanna!) can lead to bad habits, loss of focus on the big picture, and a routine that stifles creativity and excitement. Sabbatical is a way for pastors (who don't change jobs or positions often) to be renewed and reenergized for ministry without having to change churches. It also allows pastors to spend time on what they are *passionate* about, not just what we *need*. In the end, the goal is a happier, healthier, more hopeful pastor who will serve us and the wider church for many more years.

What happens to us this summer?

Pastor Mike isn't leaving us high and dry. He is confident in our care for one another and our ability to fulfill God's calling without him. He may lead Hosanna, but the ministry is our work together. We don't plan to just hold down the fort and endure until Pastor Mike gets back. We've made plans for exciting and faith-enriching events and activities, as well as some that will just be fun. Nonetheless, our Sabbatical Committee has made arrangements for other pastors to lead worship and offer us care and support.

Can I contact Pastor Mike?

We ask you to help us give Pastor Mike the space he needs to focus and tend to his own soul and relationships for these few weeks. For this reason, we ask you not to call, text, or e-mail him (he won't be checking e-mail).

Who do I call if I want pastoral support?

Whether you are facing an acute crisis and would like support ASAP, or you just need someone to talk to sometime, Pastor Jealaine Marple is here for you. She is a member of Hosanna! (along with Chris and EJ), but serves the wider church as an interim pastor. ***Do not hesitate to reach out to Pastor Jealaine at (563) 663-5598 or jealainemarple@gmail.com.*** Seriously.



What if I need ____?

Pastor Jealaine will walk with you through any crisis and conduct any (hopefully non-existent) funerals. Your Hosanna! family is also here for you. They are great supports and conversation partners. ***If you need something and you really don't know who to contact, call the church office at 816-781-7991 and Cathy will help you get connected with the right person.*** If no one answers when you call, leave a message and someone will get back to you. If your question is sabbatical-related, you can also talk with the Sabbatical Committee chair, Beth Schoening.

Who's will lead the church?

Our Congregation Council is very capable, and so is our Administrative Assistant Cathy Baker. They will all have the support of Pastor John Kreidler, another Hosanna! member and retired pastor, prison chaplain, and synod staff member. We also have people in place to do some of the routine jobs Pastor Mike takes care of, including following up with visitors.

Who's leading worship?

The pastors who will lead worship won't just be filling holes. They have been invited because their unique styles, talents, and perspectives are different than Pastor Mike's, giving us a different perspective on God and the church for a little while. We've scheduled some for multiple weeks so that we have some consistency in worship. They include:

- June 8 - Deacon Dave Mareske, director of the Hollis Renewal Center
- June 15 - Bishop Susan Candea, our Central States Synod bishop
- June 22 - Singer/storyteller Rachel Kurtz and Pastor John Kreidler
- Jun 29, July 6, 13 - Pastor Alena Vaughn, resident at Second Baptist Church
- July 20, 27, Aug. 2 - Retired and creative Pastor Paul Hegele, from Lee's Summit

What will Pastor Mike be doing?

Sabbatical isn't an extended vacation. There is a purpose and a plan. Here's an overview:

- Spending quality time with family (who live with frequent late nights and weekend commitments) through intentional activities and a little travel.

- Seeking spiritual direction (like a faith therapist), reading the Bible, and praying (not just for study or sermons).
- Taking online classes about creative and visual storytelling, as well as leadership and delegation.
- Reading and studying topics of interest to Pastor Mike, not just what is needed to accomplish a ministry goal.
- Honing his woodworking skills so that when he is back, he can take better care to relax and renew on an ongoing basis.
- Visiting the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota, learning from people with vastly different life experiences.
- Hiking and writing in the Black Hills of South Dakota. Pastor Mike will work to retell several Bible stories in a way that connects with people who are neurodivergent. The stories will be illustrated to create videos that will become freely available online.
- Trying not to do so many things that he comes back tired instead of renewed.
